Dear Residents of Grant County,

COVID-19 UPDATE FOR GRANT COUNTY

Governor Kelly issued a statewide “stay home” order in conjunction with the Kansas Essential Function Framework for COVID-19 response efforts. **EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 20-16 which goes into effect Monday March 30, 2020 at 12:01 am through April 19, 2020.** This is in conjunction with **EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 20-14.** For a copy of the order visit kdhe.ks.gov/coronavirus.

Individuals or entities who are uncertain whether they perform functions exempted from the prohibitions of this order may email KEFF@ks.gov to determine whether their functions are deemed essential.

Governor Kelly issued an executive order temporarily prohibiting mass gatherings of 10 or more people to limit the spread of COVID-19. **EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 20-14**

Grant County currently has NO POSITIVE cases.

KDHE is mandating a 14 day home quarantine for Kansans who have:

1. Traveled to California, Florida, New York, Washington State on or after March 15th, 2020
2. Traveled to New Jersey or Illinois on or after March 23rd, 2020
3. Traveled to the following counties in Colorado – Eagle Summit, Pitkin and Gunnison on or after March 8th, 2020
4. Traveled to Colorado on or after March 27th, 2020
5. Been on any cruise ship or river cruise on or after March 15th, 2020
6. Had any international travel.

This also pertains to anyone visiting your home.

Please practice social distancing of at least 6 feet apart and for no longer than 10 minutes.

Please visit **KDHE.KS.GOV** daily as the guidelines and other information changes frequently.

Please be patient as we are all experiencing this pandemic together.
